5. Presentation: David Crean, RTÉ Head of Drama

David gave an insightful presentation regarding new and returning drama to RTÉ.

He gave details of the future plans for drama programming and the process of developing new ideas and creative talent in Ireland together with co-production with international partners. David outlined RTÉ's significant level of original drama production which represents a sizable investment in Irish talent, culture and the broader creative economy. A Q&A followed.

6. Presentation: Declan McBennett, RTÉ Head of Sport

Declan gave an in-depth presentation on RTÉ's sport coverage outlining the high viewership achieved. Major sporting events in 2024 such as the Paris Olympics and UEFA Euros were discussed together with RTE Sport's focus on women's sport. Declan gave a summary of plans for 2026 including the coverage of the FIFA World Cup 2026,

the European Athletics Championships and the Winter Olympics. Declan gave insight into the acquisition of sports rights. A Q&A followed.

7. Discussion on areas of interest for Term 3

Members of the Audience Council discussed their topics of interest for term 3.

The Chair requested that members share their further ideas and proposals with Rachel Lysaght. Rachel will then provide a shortlist at the next meeting.
